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

Middle class is a construct

- The <u>idea</u> of being middle-class
 - Pay your bills
 - Own a home
 - Afford a vacation
- The <u>reality</u> of being middle-class
 - of 40% Americans cannot afford to cover an unexpected \$400 expense
 - Homeownership continues to decline lowest levels since 1995
 - Approximately 25% of Americans have not taken a vacation of a week or more in the last 5-years.

- Metropolitan Revolution
 - Fend for yourself:
 - Acting because no other level of government is acting to fulfil the needs of ones constituents
 - Activism:
 - Actively trying to influence higher-orders of government
 - Innovation:
 - Local Governments are vehicles for policy innovation




Local Governments <u>Should Be</u> Part of the Solution

Local Governments Should Be Part of the Solution

- Intergenerational Mobility
 - Central feature of American Dream: aspiration that children have a higher standard of living than their parents
 - When asked to assess economic progress, children often compare their earnings to their parents


The Geography of Intergenerational Mobility in the United States





Skyrocketing Growth of Hispanics in Nevada

- Fastest Growth of Hispanic Population in Region (1990-2016)
 - Avg. growth of Hispanic in US: 257.3% (1990~2016)
 - Growth in Nevada: 650.7% (831,000 Hispanics, 2016)
 - Nevada's Hispanic population growth much faster than Utah, Arizona &
 California
- Forecast for Hispanic Growth (2016-2050)
 - Continue to maintain rapid growth in Nevada
 - Second fastest in the region: Utah reducing gap with Nevada


Challenges to Address

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Education and Workforce Development

- Rapidly changing labor market leaving those without at least some college behind
 - Between 2010 to 2016, almost all net new jobs created were filled by workers with at least some postsecondary education.
 - Approximately two-thirds of the 13 million new jobs created since 2010 required medium or advanced levels of digital skills.


Education is the Great Equalizer

Challenges to Address

- Integration and Segregation
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Housing Affordability

- Affordable housing becoming increasingly difficult
 - Median national rents rose by 32% in constant dollars
 - Nevada at epicenter of affordability crunch largely due to emigrating Californians and Booming Economy
 - "Missing Middle" in Housing

Challenge to be addressed	Possible Local Policy and Program Solution
Integration and Segregation	Land Use Codes to develop more mixed use developments
Education and Workforce Training	Partner with Higher Ed and Private Sector to Identify Needs Partner with K-12 to Develop Career Ready Programs
Housing Affordability	Land Use Codes to Allow for More "Affordable" Units
Household Instability	Support pre-k programs Work with Private companies to assess pay smoothing
