- What are the issue/policy areas that are most likely to impact to the collective counties of Nevada over the next 3-5 years?

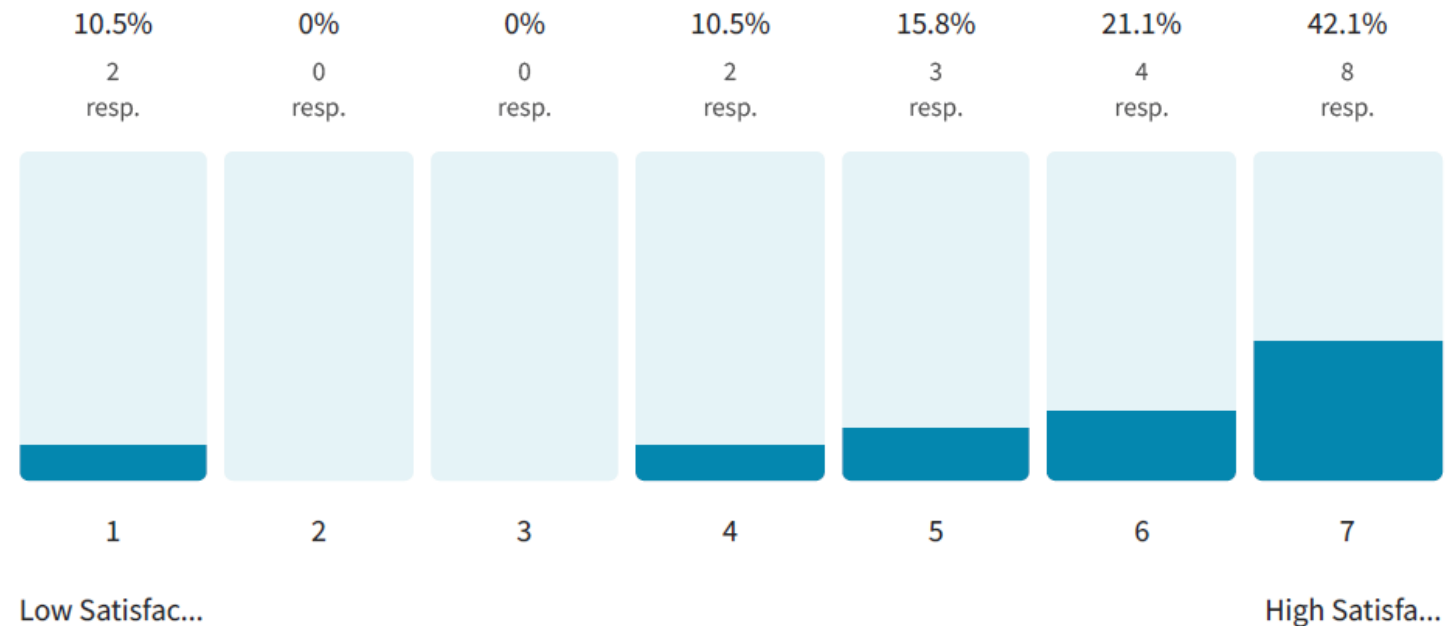
Overall Satisfaction

5.5 Average rating

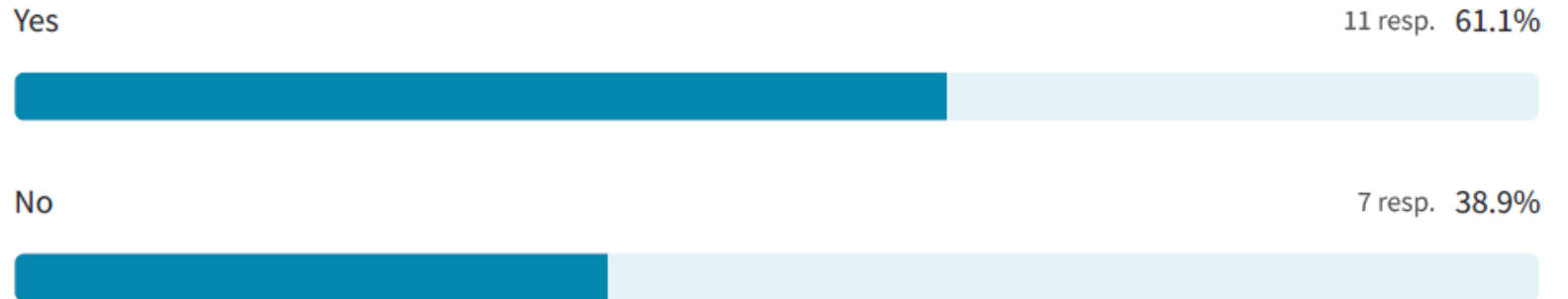


Purpose & Scope

Does this fully represent the purpose and scope of NACO?

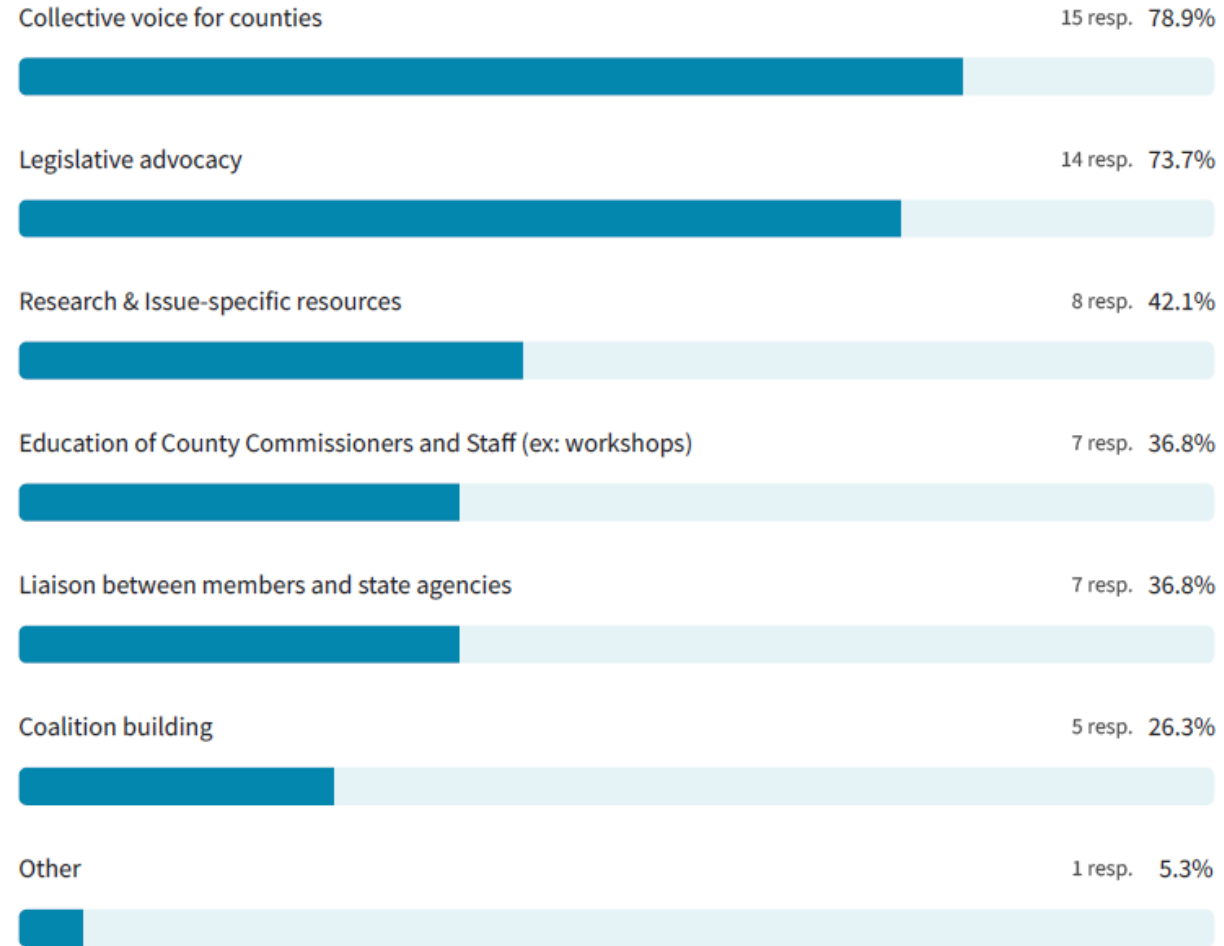
